Southeastern Oklahoma

>> DAY 1: Robbers Cave, Krebs

MORNING – We begin our time in **Southeastern Oklahoma** at **Spiro Mounds Archaeological Center**. These mounds were used by Caddoan speaking Indians between 850 and 1450 AD. Learn about the area and see artifacts with a guided tour of the site (allow 1 hour).

AFTERNOON – Lunch is included at the **Kerr Conference Center & Museum**, which was the former home of U.S. Senator Robert S. Kerr.
The center offers a beautiful view as it sits on a ridge overlooking the foothills of the **Kiamichi Mountains**. After lunch, visit the **Kerr Museum** for more information about Senator Kerr and eastern Oklahoma (allow 2 hours). Travel to **Robbers Cave State Park** in the woodlands of the **San Bois Mountains**. The park is most noted for the cave and the legend it holds as being a hideout for outlaws including Belle Star and Jesse James (allow 1 hour). Coal mining has been an important part in southeast Oklahoma development. The small community of **Krebs** was developed by Italian immigrants that worked the coal mines. Stop at **Lovera's Grocery**, which has a variety of imported Italian foods and enjoy samples of Lovera's handmade Italian cheeses and sausages (allow 45 minutes). **The Krebs Heritage Museum** contains artifacts from the mining industry, early day tools, and a rare collection of musical instruments (allow 45 minutes).

EVENING – Enjoy dinner at one of Krebs' Italian restaurants before checking into a hotel in **McAlester** for the evening.

>> DAY 2: McAlester, Hugo, Idabel

MORNING – Depart **McAlester** for the **Fort Washita Historic Site** that was built in 1842 to protect the Chickasaw and Choctaw tribes from the Southern Plains Indians (allow 45 minutes).

AFTERNOON – Enjoy some free time for lunch and gaming at the **Choctaw Casino Resort** (allow 2-3 hours) before heading east to **Hugo**, which is the winter home of many circuses. The **Hugo Frisco Depot Museum** contains memorabilia from "Circus City, USA" and a miniature circus display (allow 1 hour). Visit the **Showman's Rest Area** of **Mount Olivet Cemetery** to see unique headstones and gravesites of circus performers and owners (allow 1 hour).

EVENING – Dinner and overnight is in **Idabel**.

» DAY 3: Red River, Broken Bow

MORNING – After breakfast at the hotel, depart for the **Museum of the Red River**. The museum introduces us to the cultural heritage of the North, Central, and South Americans. See the reconstructed skeleton of a dinosaur which was found 12 miles from the museum. **The Garner Museum and Mansion** was the home of Chief of the Choctaws and holds a large collection of Indian artifacts and fossils (allow 1 hour).

AFTERNOON – After lunch in **Broken Bow**, we will enjoy a wine tasting at **Girls Gone Wine** (allow 45 minutes). Select from 16 varietals of wine and visit the gift shop before heading to **Beavers Bend State Park**. The forests of southeast Oklahoma are the number one industry in the area with over 60-million cubic feet of lumber harvested each year. Visit the **Forest Heritage Center** where 14 dioramas tell stories of the forestry industry. The center also gives honor to forest firefighters with an eightfoot bronze of Jim Burnett, the first forest firefighter from Oklahoma to lose his life fighting forest fires (allow 1 hour).

EVENING – Stay at Lakeview Lodge in **Beavers Bend State Park** on **Broken Bow Lake**.

>> DAY 4: Talihina

MORNING – Travel to **Talihina** where we begin our drive across the **Talimena National Scenic Byway** that is built specifically for its view, that winds atop the ridges of the **Ouachita National Forest**. It is known for its beauty in the fall, as well as spectacular scenery any time of the year. There are many pull out areas along the 54-mile byway for panoramic views and photo opportunities (allow 2-3 hours for the byway drive with scenic stops).

>> DAY 5: Durant, Fort Towson

MORNING – Enjoy breakfast at the casino along with some additional free time to relax or play. Depart mid-morning and head east.

AFTERNOON – Visit **Fort Towson** that was established in 1824 to protect the Choctaws. It was the ending point for the Choctaw's Trail of Tears in 1832-1834 (allow 45 minutes). Near **Millerton** is the **Wheelock Academy** that served for more than a century as a Female Seminary for Native American girls and was operated by the Choctaw Nation (allow 45 minutes).

Consider extending your tour by combining this tour with the Tulsa itinerary.
