D.W. CORRELL MUSEUM: Reminiscent of a simpler time.

Located near the original Route 66, the D.W. Correll Museum reminds you of a time when things were less complicated. The unique collections in the D.W. Correll Museum include antique automobiles, carriages, and buggies from the early 1900s, an extensive collection of rocks, minerals, seashells, coral, and gems from around the world, one-of-a-kind jewelry designed by Mr. Correll as well as a large assortment of vintage bottles and decanters. An 8' x 72' mural, created by artist Lance Hunter, decorates the outside of the museum. The award-winning artist has murals in New York, Chicago, St. Louis and Houston. The mural was designed to honor the museum's founder, D.W. Correll.



One of the most unique items in the museum is a 1902 Oldsmobile Run About. According to research, this is one of two models made prior to a fire that destroyed the factory where they were being built. All other models of that specific vintage were destroyed. The only remaining model of the same era is located in Australia.

The museum is a member of the Oklahoma Route 66 Association and the Oklahoma Museum Association.
