Built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in 1937, Roman Nose is one of seven original Oklahoma State Parks. Historically a winter campground of the Cheyenne Tribe, it is renowned for its challenging 18-hole canyon golf course, crystal clear natural springs, rock swimming pool, and abundant recreational activities.

Whether you're planning a corporate meeting, leadership retreat or family reunion, Roman Nose State Park offers a tranquil escape from everyday life. With a beautifully renovated 22-room lodge, designed to reflect and pay homage to the natural landscape of the area, reconnect with nature while relaxing in the luxury of modern amenity.

Keeping true to the original mid-century design while honoring the rich history of the Park and its Native American heritage, the newly decorated rooms feature spacious showers, organic bedding, contemporary furnishings, 42-inch LCD TVs, and eco-friendly spa products.
