Our popular Chamber Music Festival returns for its fifth season of incredible performances. Artistic Director and celebrated pianist Anne-Marie McDermott has selected a variety of moving works that will entertain classical aficionados and novices alike. Hummel, regarded during his time as a prodigy on piano, showcases lyrical charm and subtle passion. Schubert's "Trockne Blumen" is a singular virtuoso composition that features tremendously difficult passages for flute. Tchaikovsky's Piano Trio is symphonic in scale, alternating between soaring and euphoric and tragic and funereal. The double bass featured in Dvořák's String Quintet brings a fullness of sound and a rich chamber texture to this early work that is both energetic and expressive. More works to be announced closer to the Festival.

A well-known insomniac for whom night was a time for creativity and friendship, deep introspection and revelry, the iconic Leonard Bernstein loved to work and entertain at all hours. Late Night with Leonard Bernstein - hosted by his daughter Jamie and featuring acclaimed soprano Amy Burton and noted pianists John Musto and Michael Boriskin - is an affectionate multi-media portrait of the personal side of this charismatic, singularly public figure. This vibrant performance features Bernstein's most intimate (and favorite) music, including works by Aaron Copland, Zez Confrey Noël Coward, Franz Schubert, and Edvard Grieg, along with personal stories, and even audio and film clips of the Maestro himself.



Sara Evans

Over the last two decades, Sara Evans has carved out a successful career anchored by her insightful songwriting and warm, evocative voice. Now, the multi-platinum entertainer is at the top of her game. A "singer with a big voice who knows what to do with it," (NPR), Ms. Evans' sound

encompasses a broad range of styles, shifting between traditional country and a more pop and rock -inspired crossover. As the fifth most-played country radio female artist, several of her singles have reached number one on the Billboard country songs chart, including "No Place That Far," "Suds In The Bucket, "A Real Fine Place To Start," and "Born to Fly."


Buddy Guy
