Her Kind: The Witch in History, Popular Culture and Poetry: This exhibit explores the symbolism, meaning and history of witches as they have appeared in our public discourse, institutions, folklore, film and TV history, and literature. The exhibit will run through 2024.

Witches Brew Book Club: This book club accompanies the main exhibit with different books about witches. The book club will begin again in August on the 1st Thursday at 5:30 p.m. Attend as many meetings as you want or can. Books can be checked out, and a free dinner will be served.

Wacky Poem Life: This 30-minute podcast recorded at ROMP explores a poem that a visitor has left in the museum. But it is not just about poetry—it is about life in all its wacky glory. It is a fun, breezy 30 minutes with co-hosts Shaun Perkins and Bill Guthrie that anyone could enjoy. Listen at WackyPoemLife.com or anywhere you listen to podcasts.

LTAI, Let's Talk About It Book Club: This book club sponsored by Oklahoma Humanities is free to join. We read books, and different scholars from Oklahoma present programs with refreshments with each book one Thursday evening a month. The spring theme is Coming of Age in America, and the fall theme is The Way We Were, The Way We Are: Seasons in the Contemporary American Family. Look for books and specific dates on the museum website.

Craft Workshops: Cherokee artist Louisa Soap offers workshops on random Saturdays. All materials are provided free by ROMP. Check our Facebook page to be aware of which workshops are upcoming.

Martial Arts & More Class: This course, taught by martial arts expert Master Paul Flaherty, emphasizes breathing exercises, self-defense and purposeful movement. Free for all area adults. Poetry elements are incorporated throughout the class. Meets twice a week: 9-10 a.m. Mondays & Thursdays at ROMP Rummage Store, 112 E. Main.

Crime, She Said Book Club: Because of the popularity of the other book clubs, ROMP will conduct a third book club on the theme of mystery fiction and true crime written by women in the fall 2024. The club will read a book a month starting in August and meet on the second Monday of the month at noon. Lunch will be served.

Poetry on Postcards: This small exhibit in the foyer celebrates the practice of sending poetry on postcards through the mail. ROMP has been a member of the Postcrossing organization since 2013 and has received poetry on postcards and sent postcards to people all over the world. The exhibit has some of those postcards on display and a map of the world to show which countries have participated.

Autograph Book Poetry: This small display is a shortened version of an exhibit from the past that is a favorite of many museum visitors. The exhibit includes a wide variety of autograph books from the 19th and 20th centuries and takes you on a tour through the poetry within them.

19th **Amendment Centennial Exhibit**: In 2020, the museum's entire exhibit was a celebration of the centennial of the 19th amendment and women's right to vote. The museum still includes a condensed version of the exhibit with some of the artwork, poetry and activities from the original display.

Gift Shop: The museum has a small gift shop that sells some local art, handmade products, books and ROMP t-shirts, buttons and mugs. New items include handmade witch hat pillows that go along with our latest exhibit.

Wonder City Wordfest: ROMP's annual celebration of poetry, story, words, art and community is held the second Saturday in April. The day of celebration in 2024 will include giving out the awards for the annual Oklahoma Poem Contest, a live band with dancing, martial arts demonstrations, pet photography and a pet poem contest, a haiku contest, free food truck, kite decorating and flying, and many activities with prizes.

Poetry Out Loud: ROMP sponsors a regional contest for this national recitation competition. High school students in the region who do not have a contest at their schools can participate in ROMP's. The winner goes on to the state competition in Edmond. See ROMPoetry.com for details.



Poem in Your Pocket Day: Each April, the museum celebrates Poem in Your Pocket Day, an initiative from the Academy of American Poets during National Poetry Month. Pick a poem, print it out or copy it onto a page and carry it in your pocket all day. Come in the museum and read the poem to us and get a prize Apr. 18, 2024.

ROMP Rummage Store: This thrift store at 112 E. Main is the main source of income that keeps the museum open. Inside, you will find a variety of items at very low prices, including 25 cent books, \$1 clothes, jewelry, albums, toys, knickknacks and more. The store is open Mon.-Fri., 10-4, and Sat. 10-2. The second full week of each month is Bag Sale Week, with clothes \$3 a bag.

Oklahoma Poem Contest: Each year, ROMP sponsors an Oklahoma Poem Contest for people of all ages to honor the state and win cash prizes when doing so. The winners read their poems at Wonder City Wordfest each year. Details with the entry form are at the ROMP website.
